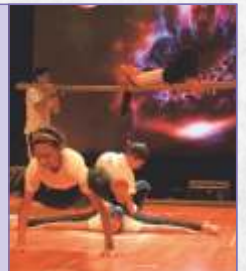

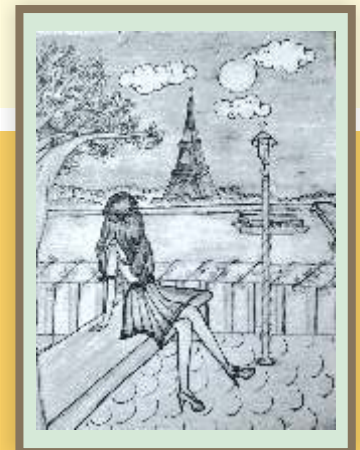
MATHS

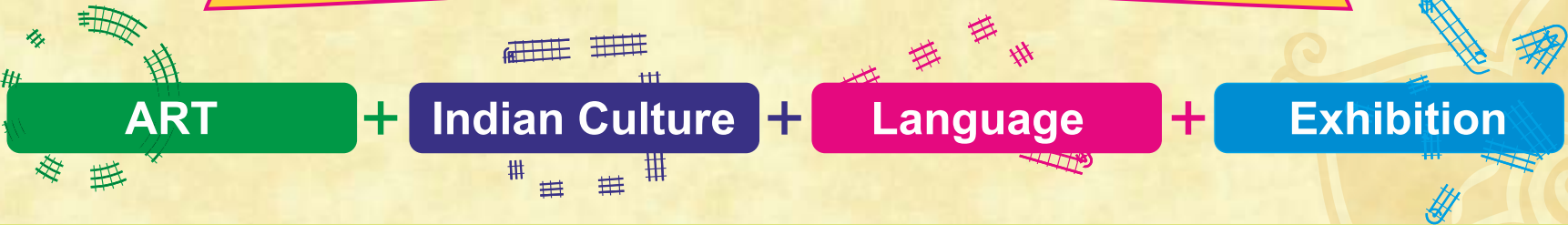

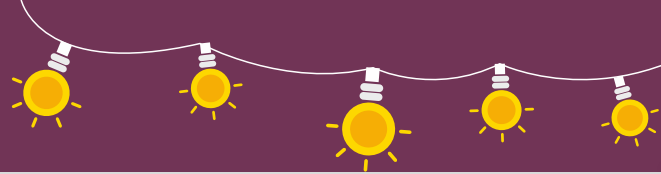


BHASHA PRADARSINI
