Parents and teachers share the responsibility of preparing a child for the 'real' world, of making them

competent autonomous beings, and of instilling the ability to pursue whatever path they choose.

However, we sometimes forget that schools and homes are not factories and children are not products to be measured, scrutinised and deliberately made to fit in a mould. The child is a being with her/his own views, thoughts and likes-dislikes. We are merely their facilitators and guides. Consider this analogy, In an ice-cream shop full of hundreds of flavours, we cannot make the child choose our favourite flavour every time. Rather, we must take them to the shop and let the child choose. When the child chooses a flavour they hate, be there with a bottle of water and offer them another chance to choose, and when the child chooses a flavour they love, let them savour every last

Having said this, children offered too much protection often fail to make independent choices and rely on others to help them choose their ice creams. Parenting that lacks discipline also

Discipline with love and hinders a child's progress and growth, making them 'spoiled brats' as famously termed.

> But what about children spoiled with excess discipline? Do you remember the phrase, "spare the rod, spoil the child"? Well, children have been proven to respond less to punishment and more to rewards and consequences. A child who's hit or yelled on for stealing a doll will maybe not steal for short term, but might engage in other disciplinary behaviours later on. Whereas, a child made to understand why stealing is bad, how they would feel when something was stolen from them, and are given a consequence related to the mistake like returning the doll and apologizing, are shown to have a 'change of heart' relatively permanently.

> Ultimately parents and teachers should strive to be loving but firm, allowing the children to develop individual thought, experience failure and face consequences of their actions. We must discipline our children with love and love our children with discipline, and maintain a delicate balance between the two.

But the danger comes as people near, The snow cats' world might disappear; Can we help it stay and live? A place in nature we must give.


If we act and show we care, The snow leopard will always be there; Let's protect its home with pride, And keep the snow cat by our side.



Importance is that, we learn about money, how to make more money from money, never go broke and always improve in terms of financial status. As students if we start to learn it now, it would prepare us for the outer world.






